Description

A short drive away is the captivating village and source of the river Sorgue, Fontaine-de-Vaucluse. Whilst the Papal city of Avignon lies 40 minutes drive to the west.

The imposing south facing property is set in beautifully manicured flat parkland of some 6 hectares which features include a boules court and children's playground. To one side of the main house sits the large and attractive pool area with heated swimming pool, covered and uncovered terracing, which features a spa, close by. Whilst on the other side of the house there is a large summer lounge/dining room, which can be used for events or large gatherings. Next to which is a games room, complete with pool table, baby foot, darts board, table tennis, air-hockey, home cinema and the like...

The creatively inspired owners have succeeded in decorating and furnishing the interiors in a stunningly innovative tasteful style, whilst the attention to detail is captivating. Each room is themed, different, eye catching and work seamlessly well against the backdrop of the original features of the spacious Provencal building. 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Layout

There are 9 bedrooms all of which have en-suite bathrooms. Two of the bathrooms have baths. All the double bedrooms have 180cm beds, which can be configured as twins. Three of the bedrooms have TVs.

Ground floor

Entrance hall. Guest WC. Large fully equipped modern kitchen. To the rear, there is secondary kitchen for outside caterers. Large dining room. Welcoming and comfortable living room. TV room. Large fully equipped laundry room. Double bedroom with en-suite bathroom and outdoor access. Separate studio with independent access, double bed, en-suite bathroom and kitchenette.

First floor

Four double bedrooms all with en-suite bathrooms. One double bedroom which has an additional single bed, baby crib and en-suite bathroom. One smaller twin bedded bedroom and en-suite bathroom. One breathtaking children`s dormitory with 5 single beds [2 of which are on a mezzanine floor] and en-suite bathroom.

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Location

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Le Luberon covers around 600sqkm and comprises of three mountain ranges, the highest peaks are around 1,250 metres high. Most of the area falls within the protection of the Parc Naturel regional du Luberon and is rich in both fauna and flora. 






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
